WHERE ARE THEY NOW







Nathan, a nine-year-old, had lots of obstacles, lots of needs and lots of potential. We learned of him then when he needed a ramp to get into his home. That was the first of many times we assisted the family. A van came next along with out of state travel costs and a beach wheelchair. We even helped arrange a regifted power chair - lots of items over lots of years, but at Lori's Voice we don 't forget.

And neither has Nathan, he quickly and easily recounts what we have done for him and his family. Today, at 18, he recognizes the impact we have had on his life - in his words "Lori's Voice has enabled me to have complete freedom to get to school and out in the community and enjoy life to the fullest, without them it would not have been possible ".







At two years old, with low muscle tone, Kylee needed a variety of things. Mom was overwhelmed when she discovered what insurance simply failed to cover. She learned of Lori's Voice at the doctor's office and over a few years we have helped Kylee with her orthotics, a walker, therapy and a communication device. Our assistance provided help to insure she had the right equipment at the right time in her life to inspire her to be her best.

So, it's been a few years - where is Kylee now? She's in Physical and Occupational therapy at Mary Free Bed and in the words of her Mother "she shows everyone, every day, how strong she is". Our help was instrumental in bringing her to where she is today - and with such a start who knows where she is headed.

WHAT DOES IT DO?

Medical breakthroughs happen regularly and for that we are thankful. But sometimes we have to ask - "what is it again that you need for your child"?. We get requests from time to time that despite how long we have been helping children they are still firsts for us. Little Jolene needed a Bioness System of braces. This system makes it easier for her to clear her foot at different walking speeds, on stairs, ramps and uneven ground. Utilizing this system has enabled her to walk barefoot with correct foot positioning, lifting, heel striking and keeping her legs straight. Testing it initially at her therapy session it enabled her to build strength and endurance. Helping her purchase this system for daily use has, in the words of her Mother "change her life dramatically" Even though a bit unusual we were glad to help.
